The event will also include a clinic that can administer low cost vaccinations and micro-chips.

There is no appointment required for the low cost vaccine package. The vaccination and micro-chip service is offered between the hours of 10am and 2pm for \$25. These services will be delivered on a first come, first served basis.

In addition to the Sterilization event, fun activities will be provided for pet owners and their families. The Mecca Community Center & Park is located at 65-250 Coahuilla Street in Mecca.



Note: Male dog sterilization will use Zeuterin, a non-surgical procedure for neutering male dogs that does not affect an animal's behavior.
