



back to golf and to achieve her dream of becoming a collegiate golfer. Perseverance (a core value she learned at First Tee) played a key role in this achievement. This upcoming fall, Maleyna will attend the University of California, Riverside where she will major in Business and play Division 1 collegiate golf.

PRESERVATION AND CONSERVANCY

Shumway Ranch sits on a 640-acre piece of land within the San Jacinto and Santa Rosa Mountains National Monument and was purchased by the State of California in 2017. Through the Coachella Valley Desert and Mountains Recreation and Conservation Authority (formed through a partnership of Desert Recreation District (District) and the Coachella Valley Mountains Conservancy (CVMC)), the management, renovation, and restoration of Shumway Ranch is underway so that wildlife preservation continues while allowing the ranch to be appropriately accessible to the public for small group educational opportunities.








Desert Recreation District is a proud **four-time** recipient of the District Transparency Certificate of Excellence. The awards are for multi-year periods dating back to 2014.
